III. Description of the academic component

1. A Course Abstract

The study of the academic discipline “Information and analytical activity in international relations” involves the study of the organization and conduct of information and analytical work in the field of international relations, the collection of information and its analytical use, the analysis of certain problems in the field of international relations, the specifics of analytics and political forecasting, the features of information and analytical support of state authorities, analytical and synthetic processing of documents (ASPD), methodological aspects of information and analytical work.

2. Goal and tasks of the academic component

The goal is to form students' knowledge of the order of organization and conduct of information and analytical work in the field of international relations, to ensure the acquisition of practical skills in collecting information and its analytical use, analyzing problems in the field of international relations.

Tasks of the discipline:

- to form the skills and ability to determine the main factors of information and analytical activity and its influence on the effectiveness of international relations;
- to reveal the forms and methods of creating an information base, monitoring events, and evaluating information;
- to teach how to navigate complex political processes, analyze their course, model and forecast the development of foreign policy of countries, justify the decisions made.

5. Tasks for independent work.

Independent work includes the theoretical study of issues related to the topics of lecture classes that were not included in the theoretical course, or were considered very briefly, their in-depth study according to the recommended literature, as well as the completion of homework in order to consolidate the theoretical material, study the literature for preparation for seminar classes, preparation for the exam.

Individual research project

According to the course, students complete the individual research project, which is estimated at 16 points. The task is the following: select a country from the list and analyze the state of the state's information policy.

Countries: USA, Canada, Russia, Japan, China, Baltic States, Poland, Czech Republic, Slovakia, Hungary, Romania and Bulgaria, Germany, France, Great Britain and Ireland, Spain, Portugal, Greece, Italy, Turkey, Iran, Iraq, Afghanistan, Austria, Switzerland and Liechtenstein, Australia, New Zealand, Scandinavian countries, countries of the African continent, Brazil, Venezuela, Egypt, Turkey, Algeria, Syria, India.

IV. Evaluation Policy

The teacher's policy regarding the student

Class attendance is a mandatory component of the grade for which points are awarded. For objective reasons (for example, illness, international internship, participation in scientific events, etc.), training can be arranged (during this period) in online form or according to an individual plan in agreement with the teacher.

In the conditions of martial law or quarantine restrictions, the educational process at the University can be carried out in a mixed form of education, namely: face-to-face in the classroom or remotely in Microsoft Teams .

V. Final Control

According to the course, the student completes three modular control papers, each of which is assessed at 20 points, total - 60 points. The performance of works requires the student to show the acquired theoretical knowledge and approach the projects creatively.

1 MCP - "Read the politician": students watch videos of selected pairs of politicians and make a comparative analysis of verbal and non-verbal communication. Couples: M. Saakashvili and P. Klimkin; D. Trump and A. Merkel; V. Putin and B. Jones; E. Macron and S. Jinping; Kim Jong Un and R. Erdogan.

2 MCP: Essay on "The work of the special services of the USA and the Russian Federation": students watch two films "Red Sparrow" https://kinanema.net/load/filmi_ukrajinskoju/chervonij_gorobec/120-1-0-12837 and "Bridge of Spies" https://kinanema.net/load/filmi_ukrajinskoju/mist_shpiguniv_2015/120-1-0-6351 and make a comparative analysis of the activities of intelligence, diplomacy and special services in the form of an essay.

3 MCP: to compile a forecast tree of information security problems in Ukraine based on the video of the round table "Information Security at the Modern Stage" (February 27, 2020), organized by the NGO "Communication and Content Security Center"; NGO "Organization for consumer protection in cyberspace" with the assistance of Ukrinform - <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=4N70Rw6TXbs>.

The exam is the form of final control. However, if the student has received a total of at least 75 scores for all types of work, he/she may not pass the exam. If he/she has 75 points or more, but wants to improve his/her result, he/she passes the exam. The exam is conducted orally. The exam ticket includes 3 questions. On the exam, the student receives from 0 to 60 scores. The total number of scores for the course is 100. It is formed as the sum of the scores for the current assessment (40 scores) and the final assessment (60 scores).
