III. DESCRIPTION OF THE ACADEMIC COMPONENT

1. A Course abstract.

The academic component «Ukraine in European Cultural and Historical Contexts» belongs to the cycle of general training, which forms a systematic view of the history and culture of Ukraine in an inextricable connection with the European historical and cultural space, studies, compares and rethinks the course of political, socio-economic and cultural processes in Ukraine in the European context, contributes to awareness of the need to establish an independent Ukraine and its entry into the European Union as an equal partner.

2. Goal and tasks of the academic component

The *goal* of the course is to acquaint students with the centuries-old past of Ukraine in the aggregate of social and cultural phenomena and events, in their progressive development with the historical regularities of the complex process of the formation and development of the Ukrainian state as a European country from the earliest times to the present days.

The *main tasks* of the course are: to give students knowledge about the main directions, trends and regularities of the formation and development of Ukrainian statehood; to reveal their organic unity and at the same time specificity in the context of European civilization; to acquaint students with the latest achievements of Ukrainian and European historical science; to teach students to operate freely with historical and cultural categories and concepts and to understand their genesis; to form in students the ability to independently identify, study and analyse historical and cultural processes, events and phenomena; to develop a sense of patriotism, respect for the historical past of their people.

5. Individual task/Individual work of the student

Upon completion, receive certificates on the platform of massive open online courses Prometheus and prepare a short presentation on the use of the acquired knowledge on real examples.

IV. EVALUATION POLICY

The instructor's evaluation policy regarding the student.

- class attendance is mandatory;
- maximum number of permitted absences -2;

- under the condition of important reasons (participation in scientific events, sick leave), training can take place according to an individual plan agreed with the teacher.

Academic Integrity Policy.

- zero tolerance for write-offs.

Deadlines and Retaking policy.

Seminar classes are retaken if there are substantial reasons. Topics that are submitted in violation of deadlines without valid reasons are evaluated at a lower grade.

V. FINAL CONTROL

The form of final control is a credit, which is set based on the results of the types of work that are provided for in the syllabus of the educational component. Tasks from these types of current control are evaluated in the range from 0 to 100 points. The student can additionally pass the topics he missed during the semester (for valid reasons) in consultation with the teacher, thus improving his result by exactly the amount of points provided for the missed topics. In the event that a student received less than 60 points, he makes a credit during the liquidation of academic debt. In this case, the points scored during the current assessment are cancelled. The maximum number of points during the liquidation of academic debt from credit is 100.
