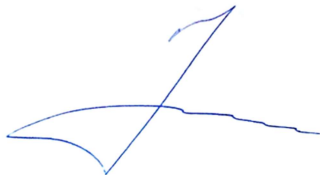

III. Description of the academic component

1. Academic Component (AC) Abstract

Strategies for Peace and International Security is a comprehensive AC that examines the legal, political and economic strategies that governments and international organizations use to maintain international peace and security. The AC covers the topics of the international security environment and strategic approaches to ensuring security, activities of the UN, OSCE, Council of Europe, strategies of non-governmental organizations, NATO and the European Union, non-European regional and national strategies. In addition, the course examines current affairs and conflicts and explores their implications for international peace and security. The course also includes discussions on how to develop and implement effective strategies to maintain peace and security.

Prerequisites (previous courses on which the study of the educational component is based): International Relations and World Politics, Information Policy and Security.

2. The goal and tasks of the educational component

The goal of AC is to acquire theoretical knowledge and practical skills in assessing current and potential challenges and threats to national security in the aspect of national, regional and block international security strategies.

The main tasks of AC are the following: the acquisition by students of the knowledge, skills and abilities necessary for understanding the main trends and perspectives of modern politics, the ability to understand the driving forces and regularities of the development of the historical process in the field of international security; development of students' ability to professionally analyze and clarify the positions of Ukraine regarding the main problems and trends of international security; formation of knowledge and understanding of the main strategic directions of the foreign policy of the leading states, features of their diplomacy and relations with Ukraine on international security issues, understanding of the basics of international conflict regulation using diplomatic and other methods used in international practice.

IV. Evaluation Policy

The Microsoft 365 cyber environment (MS Teams and SharePoint) is used during the course study. For this purpose, the use of mobile devices is encouraged - the BYOD (Bring Your Own Device) approach is used. During classroom classes, communication is carried out in the virtual environment of the course in real time. Recording of work time and activity of higher education applicants is additionally recorded in automatic mode. Assignments are assigned and graded in the course team environment (MS Teams).

Attendance and/or participation: attendance and active participation is a graded component of the graded course, remote online participation of the student is allowed provided that he has the appropriate technical means - in this case, an online meeting is held in the MSTeams team.

Academic integrity and cooperation: violation of copyright norms is not allowed, if plagiarism is detected, the student's written work is not evaluated. Group work with the presentation of its results is encouraged in the «Space for collaboration» section of students' personal electronic notebooks.

Students with disabilities: can participate remotely (online) based on personal application.

Statement on the state of health of students: in case of deterioration of health, he can take remote online participation in classes based on a personal written request (by e-mail or in the posts of the MS Teams team).

Delays in execution: allowed if there are compelling circumstances that prevented timely presentation, which is documented (for example, a doctor's certificate).

Re-evaluation: allowed on the basis of a justified written request of the student (by e-mail or in the posts of the MSTEams), but no later than within one week after the main evaluation.

Attendance and/or Participation Policy: Attendance and active participation is an assessed component of the course

V. Final Control

The final control in the form of a credit is regulated by the Regulation on the current and final assessment of knowledge of students of higher education of Lesya Ukrainka Volyn National University (https://ed.vnu.edu.ua/wp-content/uploads/2023/09/2023_Polozh_pro_otzin_%D0%A0%D0%B5%D0%B4_%D1%80%D0%B5%D0%B4%D0%9C%D0%95%D0%94.pdf).

The credit is given based on the results of the current work, provided that the student has completed the types of educational work specified in the syllabus. If the student did not attend individual classroom classes (for valid reasons), he/she has the right to work through the missed classes and get the number of points that was determined for the missed topics at the counseling sessions. On the date of the assessment, the teacher records in the report the amount of current points that the student scored during the current work (scale from 0 to 100 points).

If the student has scored less than 60 points during the current work, he/she will be credited during the liquidation of academic debt. In this case, the points scored during the current evaluation are canceled. The maximum number of credit points during the liquidation of academic debt is 100.
