#### III. Description of the academic component

#### 1. A Course Abstract

Communication component of conflicts. Information support of the conflict. Media as a non-military method of influence in hybrid warfare. Work ethics of journalists in the conflict zone. Hate speech. Media reports from the war. New communication channels in disseminating information about conflict/war. Narratives in times of war/conflict. Agents of influence. Propaganda. Fight against disinformation, fakes, manipulation. Media as a conflict mediator.

# 2. Goal and tasks of the academic component

The goal of the course is to provide knowledge about the role of the media both in fueling the conflict and in conflicts regulation and resolution.

The main tasks of the course are to study the specifics of the activities of journalists in the conflict zone; peculiarities of narratives, propaganda and disinformation in the period of conflict/war; formation of skills of analytical work in the information space.

#### IV. Evaluation Policy

# The teacher's policy regarding the student

Attendance at lectures is mandatory, lateness to classes is unacceptable (demonstrates disorganization and disrespect of the student), but is not punished. If the student was present at all the lectures, he/she can get an additional 10 points.

For objective reasons (for example, illness, international internship, participation in scientific events, etc.), training can take place during this period in online form or according to an individual plan in agreement with the teacher.

# **Deadlines and Rescheduling Policy.**

All theoretical tasks are submitted on the day of the seminar. Laboratory works can be submitted during the week. Working students coordinate the assignment schedule with the teacher. Missed classes are given up only if there is confirmation of a valid reason for the absence (certificate of absence due to illness or a statement about the need to miss classes). Modular test papers are not resubmitted.

If the student has completed the training and received the relevant Certificate, then the topic/topics of the discipline or modular test papers (work) can be counted (depends on the subject of the training and is decided separately in each individual case).

If a student has undergone training under the project "EU Strategic Communications: Countering Destructive Influences" of the ERASMUS+ program, Jean Monnet Module (No. 101047033 ERASMUS-JMO-2021-MODULE)", he/she may not attend the discipline and will be evaluated based on the results of the Project Certificate.

#### V. Final Control

The final control in the form of credit is regulated by the Regulation on the organization of the educational process at the first (bachelor) and second (master) levels at Lesya Ukrainka Volyn National University (<a href="https://ed.vnu.edu.ua/wpcontent/uploads/2022/08/2022Polozhennya\_pro\_org\_anizatsiyu\_navch.\_pr\_otsesu\_u\_VNU\_%D1%80%D0%B5%D0%B4.pdf">https://ed.vnu.edu.ua/wpcontent/uploads/2022/08/2022Polozhennya\_pro\_org\_anizatsiyu\_navch.\_pr\_otsesu\_u\_VNU\_%D1%80%D0%B5%D0%B4.pdf</a>).

The exam is the form of final control. However, if the student has received a total of at least 75 scores for all types of work, he/she may not pass the exam. If he/she has 75 points or more, but wants to improve his/her result, he/she passes the exam. The exam is conducted orally. The exam ticket includes 3 questions. On the exam, the student receives from 0 to 60 scores. The total number of scores for the course is 100. It is formed as the sum of the scores for the current assessment (40 scores) and the final assessment (60 scores).
